











1. A committee will be formed to finalize the uniform details. The committee will make a decision within the next two weeks.

- A plan will be developed to increase active participation of women in various social activities.













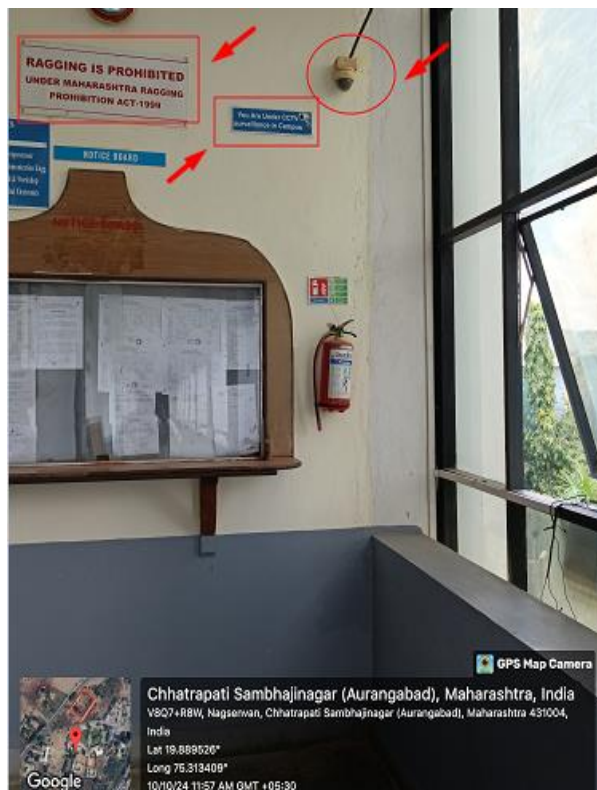
